Case Presentation

A 75-year-old gentleman presented with right hip and back pain for the past 3 months with acute urinary retention (AUR). He has been on self-catheterization for the last 1 month to help relieve his symptoms. Per rectal examination revealed an enlarged prostate gland. Hip examination was normal and patient was able to weight bear. Pelvic radiograph was done for assessment of the right hip pain. His prostate specific antigen (PSA) level was more than 100ng/ml.

What are the radiographic findings (Figure 1) and the possible causes?
